The League of Nations

The league of nation was international organization founded on 10 January 1920 as result of Paris peace conference that ended the First World War. It was the first international organization whose principal mission was to maintain world peace its primary goals, as stated in its covenant, included preventing wars through collective security and disarmament and setting international disputes through negotiation and arbitration after a number of notable successes and some early failures in the 1920s the league ultimately proved in capable of preventing aggression by the Axis powers in the 1930s.

Germany withdrew from the league, as did Japan, Italy, Spain and other. The lonset of the second world was showed that the league had failed its primary purpose which was to prevent any future world war.

The league lasted for 26, the united nation (UN) replaced it after the end of the second world was on 20 April 1964 and inherited a number of agencies and by the league.
